EDMUND RICE COMMUNITY PAPUA NEW GUINEA ENCOUNTER 2010

In July this year Chris Mousley, Bernard White, and Tarni Raich had the opportunity to take part in a cultural immersion and social justice encounter in Port Moresby, Goroko, and We-wak in Papua New Guinea.

During our encounter we visited some incredible places and had the privilege to meet with a number of inspirational individuals: a community of young people, not much older than ourselves, training to become teachers so they could bring the gift of education back to their remote communities where they themselves had received less than sufficient education; the inhabitants of Cheshire Homes, who are living with a range of physical disabilities but awed us



with their passion and joy for life; and the employees of Mount Sion, teaching Braille to vision impaired school children with very limited resources and bringing support and liberation to those suffering from mental illness in some extremely remote communities, just to name a few.

Through our experience we recognised the crucial capacity of education and knowledge to create change in society and to overcome the many challenges they face. We feel privileged to have had the opportunity to learn from the people we met and hope that our presence had a similarly positive impact.

In fact, people were so generous to us in our fundraising, that we have been able to make donations from our surplus to the Sacred Heart Teachers College, Bomana, Port Moresby, the Mount Sion School for the Blind in Goroka for staff training, and the Maprick Project of Callen Services to the disabled in the West Sepik region.

It was immensely humbling to experience firsthand the extent of the divide between the comforts and the excesses of the developed world and the poverty of the developing world. We live a privileged existence and that privilege is something, we have learned, should never be taken for granted. We were both impacted by the people we met and the facets of their lives that they shared with us – their joys and their hardships – and it is this renewed vision of the world that we hope to bring back with us, to affect our work, our studies, our home and community life, and without a doubt, the cross cultural and social justice experiences we both plan to undertake in the future.

By meeting new people and groups we had the opportunity to learn a great deal about ourselves and our own values. Also by networking we can be a form of support for each other and this can only be a positive thing for the future.

In being passionate about social justice, it is easy to have a simplistic view of the world's issues: poverty, disease, corruption etc. What really impacted on us was that every society has its own challenges, and these are often far more complex than they appear on the surface. This broader perspective and understanding is something we have brought back with us, and hope to reflect in our daily lives, and share with our friends, family, community, and the wider Edmund Rice Network.

ERISJ Aboriginal Leadership Advisory Council

The ERISJ Aboriginal Leadership Program supports the identification, development and nurture of personal, cultural and professional skills useful to current and emergent Aboriginal leaders. The Program's premise is the centrality of Aboriginal leadership to the wellbeing of Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal Australia. That the median age of Aboriginal Australia is 21 (when Australia overall is 37) underscores that Aboriginal youths will likely need to be equipped with leadership skills earlier than their non-Aboriginal counterparts.

Further, the Program disseminates insightful Aboriginal skills and capacities not widely present within non-Aboriginal Australia - and vice-versa. In this and other respects, the Program hopes to contribute to the national post-Reconciliation Dialogue.

The ERISJ Aboriginal Leadership Program Advisory Council is comprised of Aboriginal Australians who are eminent educators and leaders within Aboriginal Australia.

The ERISJ Aboriginal Leadership Program Advisory Council advises the ERISJ Director and Board to support:

- Aboriginal perspectives and delivery as central to the ERISJ Aboriginal Leadership Program;
- the usefulness of identified Program objectives, content, methods and presenters; and
- promotion of the program in a culturally relevant form.

Exemplary Social Justice Action: What Works and Why? - 3 Case Studies

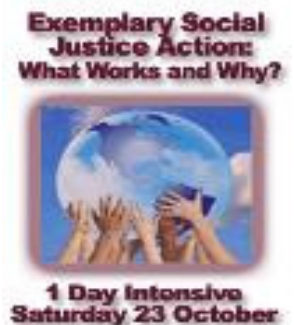
ERISJ One-Day Intensive Saturday 23 October 2010: 10.00 am - 5:00 pm

- how to deal with problems that confront most important campaigns;
- the effectiveness of campaigns when they combine thinking, action, creativity and ethical decency; and
- that personal resilience requires the nurturing of energy, passion, inspiration, joy and 'a life' during sustained campaigns.
